

## Comet NEOWISE: Beautiful Sight During A Gloomy Year

Except for several planetary groupings (e.g. Jupiter and Saturn), 2020 looked like it would be bad year for notable astronomical events. Then along comes Comet NEOWISE, named for NASA's re-purposed "Near-Earth Object Wide-field Infrared Survey Explorer" spacecraft. The comet is considered the best to appear since Hale-Bopp in the mid-1990s, loitering in the north circumpolar sky for over a month. Scores of AAAP members have logged observations and taken images of the comet, perhaps in part from everyone having to stay at home so much. In fact, NEOWISE may be the best-imaged comet in AAAP history. Many members also went to our observatory sites (primarily Wagman) to image and simply drink in this beautiful object.
